Daily Operations / What's Happening: The City of White Salmon Code Compliance webpage is now live and updated regularly, please have a look. Current Project(s): Case report streamline between SmartGov & Spillman platforms. Mapping violations & site-visit requests for case mgt. efficiency Mobilizing day-to-day (Wi-Fi, on-site/case-building interface) A Code Compliance program review started on April 1, 2024, and is ongoing. As of July 1, 2024, 139 site visit requests have been identified as status unknown. Site visits will be conducted to address these requests and review compliance.
